Consecration Sunday





THE POWER OF SHOWING UP

In the hustle and bustle of everyday life, we often underestimate the power of simply being present. Yet, for Sandi Stone, this simple act has become her guiding principle. “I didn’t do anything. I just showed up,” she humbly remarked a month ago, capturing the essence of what it means to be a truly impactful volunteer.

Sandi’s journey with the food pantry began with a simple commitment to be present. Every Wednesday, she dedicates her time to unload deliveries from Caring Hands, a task that might seem mundane to some, but is vital for the smooth operation of the pantry. In a world where multitasking is often glorified, Sandi’s dedication to being there, consistently, is a reminder of the power of presence.

Her involvement doesn’t stop at the food pantry. Sandi is actively engaged in numerous church ministries, including hospitality, the congregational team, and the angel tree project. Each role she takes on is anchored by her initial philosophy: just show up.

While Sandi might downplay her contributions, those around her see the magic she creates by just being there. She has a unique ability to hear a need—whether it’s a passing comment or an urgent requirement—and respond to it, often making things appear in the pantry as if by magic. Her actions remind us that sometimes, the most profound impact comes not from grand gestures, but from small, consistent acts of kindness.

After the Covid-19 pandemic, Sandi, like many others, found herself feeling disconnected from her community. Her involvement in various church activities became a way to rebuild those connections, not just with people, but with her faith and purpose. It’s a testament to the healing power of community service and the profound connections it fosters.

Outside of her volunteer work, Sandi is a devoted mother to her daughter, Dani, and an avid hobbyist. Whether she’s cross-stitching, reading, or collecting fabrics for quilting, she finds joy in the quiet moments of life. An interesting tidbit about Sandi is her summer stint as a nanny for Marlon Perkins’ grandchildren, a unique chapter in her life!

Sandi’s story is a poignant reminder of the impact of showing up. In a world where the emphasis is often on doing more, Sandi exemplifies the value of being present. Her journey teaches us that sometimes, the most important thing we can do is to simply be there, ready to listen, observe, and act. Sandi’s quiet dedication inspires us to consider how we can show up in our own lives and the lives of others.

In every corner of the church, Sandi’s presence is felt, a testament to the influence one person can have by just being present. Let her story encourage all of us to embrace the power of showing up and see where it might lead us.
