

Rev. Alexis recently asked our congregation for their thoughts on how Oakwood could be more welcoming to all. We received about 70 responses on the cards we handed out during worship service. The comments were all valuable to us and give good insight into how we can always welcome the people who walk through our doors.

The most frequent observation was that we need to increase the number of young people, of all ages, to our church as well as people of different ethnicities. How do we do this, you might ask. There were several ideas, but people said most frequently to *invite*, family, friends, and neighbors to church.

In addition, we should invite more groups to use our facility, similar to the quilters, the AA group, Boy Scouts and 4-H that already meet at Oakwood. Maybe there are other groups we could start, for example it was suggested we start a knitters group or other interest group.

Many thought we are already a friendly, welcoming church, but we need to make sure first-time attendees don't get lost on Sunday morning. Welcome them, sit with them and invite them back: something we all can do.

As our church leaders and leadership committees plan for next year, they will be using these comments to guide them when appropriate. In the meantime, ask yourself what can I do and most importantly, ask God to guide you in how to give of your time and energy to Oakwood.
